Meeting Summary

- 1. Eric let us know that Chris Ehlers passed away on April 19th. There were many condolences and expressions of appreciation for Chris's contributions.
- 2. Ryan will edit the announcement requesting comments on GSP Sections 1 and 2 and send out to the group for review. The final text can be used for posting on GSA websites and Board information. Comments are due back on June 15th.
- 3. Most GSA can review the GSP sections within 30 days however DWD may need 45 to 60 days for legal review, Nacho is confirming this. The GSP schedule will be discussed further at the next meeting.
- 4. Monitoring Wells in RD 800- Bill Brewster explained that DWR has three wells in the ECC Subbasin (BD-1, 2, and 3) but have been denied permission to monitor. If ECC can transfer ownership, they could monitor and maintain these wells and add to the ECC groundwater monitoring network. Otherwise they will be destroyed in 1-2 years. The wells have a long history (1998-2014) of water levels, are about 100' deep, and would be beneficial to the ECC network. Aaron mentioned that CCWD has a facility on Old River that could potentially be explored as a site to install a new dedicated monitoring well. Ryan will follow up with Jeff Conway and the request by ECC GSAs to monitor the three wells.
- 5. Modeling Assumptions were reviewed for:
 - a. Area of Delta Drains. Reclamation Districts will be contacted to confirm where subsurface drains are located and their depth. BBID will send a map of the 7 miles of drains in the district.
 - b. Location of Simulated Wells-comments included: TODB does not have domestic wells; Add Stonecreek well to DWD; send Aaron a zoomed in map of ECCID for review; Brentwood is OK.
- 6. Brentwood sent the invoice to GSAs. Please confirm the GSA address is correct.
- 7. June 1st, LSCE will send out invoices and billing rate letter to update for GSA O&C hours (2019 to June 2020).
- 8. Interbasin Coordination-Eric has a call with Solano Subbasin at 11 a.m. Friday May 15th.
- 9. Reviewed Beneficial User list and Group provided additional names to contact.
- 10. The next GSP Working Group Conference Call is Wednesday June 10, 2020.

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON DRAFT GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY PLAN, SECTIONS 1 & 2

[CONTRA COSTA, CA] - The East Contra Costa Groundwater Sustainability Working Group is seeking input on Sections 1 and 2 of a Draft Groundwater Sustainability Plan (Plan). Comments are due June 15, 2020. The Plan is required under the 2014 Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). Additional sections will be released on a quarterly basis throughout 2020. In announcing the release of the draft sections [Name of your Agency] [Title of important person] [Name of important person] explained, "We are happy to be one of the agencies participating in this process. Developing a sustainability plan is an important step in meeting the requirements of SGMA to support and maintain a healthy groundwater basin. We are confident we will continue to achieve the state's goals through the 2042 deadline."

Section 1 of the plan provides background information including the purpose of the plan. Section 1 also includes more about the East Contra Costa agencies that will manage the plan implementation. Section 2 outlines the planning area and the data that is being used to prepare the plan. It also considers water and land use related topics including current and historic uses and the General Plans guiding land use. Another element is a description of economically disadvantaged areas with in the subbasin. The last part of the section describes county wells, permitting and well protection.

The table of contents for the full draft plan is located **HERE**. Prior to offering comments, reviewers are encouraged to read through the table of contents and learn more about the topics that will be considered in the remaining sections. A copy of Sections 1 & 2 is HERE.


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Attachment 1b DWR Seepage Wells




Seepage Wells DWR may be destroying.






BD Well Locations


