Meeting Summary

- 1. Locations of domestic and agricultural wells has been identified as a data gap for the ECC GSP. Although Data Gaps are not required to be completed for the initial submission of the GSP, we discussed an approach to find locations and owner contact information. Dan and Eric both had suggestions on how to identify properties with domestic wells in DWD and Brentwood.
- 2. Ryan- the County is currently updating the General Plan and he encourages coordination of the goals and policies with the GSP and cities General Plans.
- 3. Lisa Beutler- discussed how to publicize Section 3.
 - a. She will prepare a survey specifically for Section 3 and will work with Jill to post it on the ECC GSP website (similar to the previous sections).
 - b. Based on Lisa's experience, the most successful outreach method for this subbasin are emailed invitations to about 100 people on the interested partis list.
 - c. Lisa will contact the Horseman's Association: 1) to ask if they would be willing to post ECC GSP information in their newsletter 2) this would potentially be a way to find domestic well owners.
- 4. Paul: The City of Oakley will be in sync with the County and GSP goals and policies. Bethel Island information can be included in the County General Plan. Elected officials have constituent emails that can be used to get the GSP message out.
- 5. Monthly ECC GSP Updates fliers are useful and LSCE will continue to send out at the end of each month.
- 6. GSP Section status was reviewed (see agenda below).
- 7. Eric reported that Brentwood had received payment for Progress Report 7 and checks would be sent out soon.
- 8. Bill Brewster reported that fall water level measurements are to be submitted now for CASGEM and if they cannot be collected to input a "NM" code.
