Meeting Summary

1. Well Permitting Management Action Discussion:
 - a. Jackson provided an example of how another GSA handled new well permitting processes.
 - i. [NKGSA-Policy-2021-001-Approved-Feb-25-2021.pdf \(northkingsgsa.org\)](#)
 - b. Ryan contacted the Contra Costa County Environmental Health Land Use Program for well permitting guidance. They discussed how a well permitting process would work and how to write it.
 - i. He will talk to CCC Council because changes might require an ordinance code change. This management action could be phased in over the next few years once the process is flushed out.
 - c. Vicki suggested that it would be beneficial to include a well permitting management action in the ECC GSP, but it is not clear the level of detail needed. She asked Jackson if DWR will have comments on the GSPs submitted in January 2020 that could be used to guide GSPs to be submitted in January 2022.
 - d. Jackson said that DWR:
 - i. may not have comments on the 2020 submitted GSPs in time to be used in preparing the 2022 GSPs.
 - ii. does not offer comments on parts of the GSP prior to submission. But he will ask. The SGMA regulations are the best available guidelines.
2. Section 9 Plan Implementation
 - a. Ryan provided a summary of the GSAs meeting to discuss the Plan Implementation budget and the follow up meeting with LSCE.
 - i. Debbie will provide an updated budget with a cost range for each task.

- ii. This section informs DWR that the GSAs have considered implementation costs but does not need to be exact.
 - iii. Jackson said that DWR does not have a detailed checklist for the 5-year update and the regulations are the best source of information on the contents. Also, DWR does not have a checklist or guidelines for outreach and communication for plan implementation.
 - iv. Potential sources of plan implementation funding per Jackson:
 1. AB 1500 Chapter 4 – 80543 (2-year bond)
 2. Governor’s revised budget (one time funding)
 3. Maggie Dunton suggested that GSAs provide a letter of support.
3. Lisa Beutler with Stantec provided a summary of outreach and communication progress.

4. Maggie let the group know that the Subbasin will not be eligible for Round 2 Implementation funding as the money has already been allocated to other projects.
5. Debbie reviewed the schedule for adopting and finalizing the GSP and reminded the group that each GSA will need to submit 90-day notice of intent to adopt before July 1st. Progress Report 10 was submitted to DWR on April 22 and Brentwood signed on April 28th.

Attachment 1

Notice of Intent to adopt a GSP

A GSA may adopt a GSP only after a public hearing is held with at least 90 days' advance notice to the city or county within the area of the proposed plan or amendment.

Regulation:

10728.4. ADOPTION OR AMENDMENT OF PLAN FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEARING

A groundwater sustainability agency may adopt or amend a groundwater sustainability plan after a public hearing, held at least 90 days after providing notice to a city or county within the area of the proposed plan or amendment. The groundwater sustainability agency shall review and consider comments from any city or county that receives notice pursuant to this section and shall consult with a city or county that requests consultation within 30 days of receipt of the notice. Nothing in this section is intended to preclude an agency and a city or county from otherwise consulting or commenting regarding the adoption or amendment of a plan.

California Water Code Section 10728.4 also requires the GSA to review and consider any comments received from the County in response to this notice, and to consult with the County if requested within thirty days of receipt of this notice.
